

HUCK AND FRIENDS

DESCRIPTION: Huck is a versatile weave structure that produces lovely open fabric. With one threading, it's possible to weave spots of huck or all-over areas of huck lace. In this class we'll discuss the basics of huck, weave examples of both spot huck and huck lace, and learn how to design original pieces using huck structure. We'll also explore some related weave structures. Students will weave on their own looms, which they will have warped before the class. This is not a round-robin class.

LENGTH: Two and half days

EXPERIENCE LEVEL: This class is for anyone who can warp a loom independently.

STUDENT SUPPLY LIST:

A 4-shaft loom with an 11-inch weaving width, warped with 10/2 cotton set at 20 ends/inch. The warp will be 209 ends and 3 yards long—about 3 ounces. Weft yarn of 10/2 cotton—about 600 yards (3 ounces).

For weaving they will need:

- 2 shuttles and multiple bobbins.
- Scissors.
- Tape measure.
- Paper for note taking.
- Pencil or pen.
- Fraycheck.
- Any other weaving aids you use.
- Bobbin winder.

CLASS SIZE: Class size is limited to 15.
